



Policy – Student Management

Rationale

All staff will implement systems that provide effective student management therefore creating a positive learning environment. The Learning and Behaviour Support Team will provide guidance and support for issues that affect the well being of students.

Guidelines

- Effective teaching and behaviour management systems should be seen as mutually supportive.
- Systems should direct and encourage the student to develop responsibility for their own behaviour.
- Systems will be consistent, appropriate and positive in nature.
- Student's rights will be respected.
- Student management is a shared responsibility between the school, students and Parent/caregivers.
- The statutory obligations relating to stand downs and the exclusion of students will be adhered to by the Board and Principal.
- Students will be referred to the relevant agencies or provided with support so as to enable them to take an active, positive role in school and home life.

The Learning and Behaviour Support Team will be co-ordinated by the D.P and have a representative from:

- The staff
- R.T.L.B service
- Public Health Nurse

1. The group will meet fortnightly to manage student issues.
2. Referrals will be accepted from staff and parent/caregivers.
3. A student will remain on the list until a suitable system has been put in place and or the problem resolved.
4. The group will decide on and record what it considers to be the best course of action for each individual case ie referral to the relevant agencies.
5. Team members will be responsible for following up their cases and reporting back to the next meeting.
